

RE-OPENING OF SCHOOL.

It is sincerely hoped that everyone is continuing to keep safe and well.

A very large number of you have responded to the questionnaire – you are kindly asked to make every effort to fill it in by mid day tomorrow, June 9th please – if you have not already done so. We fully understand that it's difficult to make a decision, and until we've received the Welsh Government guidelines, it's very difficult for us to give the exact details as to how it's all going to operate. The guidelines are to arrive on Wednesday, June 10th. We are busy at present looking at various options. It is emphasised again that the main aim of the questionnaire at present is to have a clear view of the numbers and a general feeling, as a guide to move forward.

At the moment, I can share a few general points of information with you, which are as follows:

- *School life will be very different from when we had to close the school.*
- *The children will be coming to school four times during the month.*
- *Due to the high number of pupils in each school year, it will not be practically possible to have families in at the same times.*
- *The start and finish times will be staggered.*
- *The Resilience Hub for children of key workers will be operational in school – and those pupils attending the Hub will not be able to attend the pod within the class – i.e. no pupil can access both the class and Hub during the month.*
- *Before and After School Clubs will not be operational from June 29th to July 24th.*

I will be in contact with you when the guidance from Welsh Government and the Local Education Authority have been received.

I know that we can rely on your co-operation as always, during this difficult time.
