WHAT IS THE PARENTS' FORUM?

- Hold meetings in a mutually supportive environment
- Improve communication between parents/ carers and staff/governors.

HOW WILL THE MEETINGS WORK?

Arrangements will be decided by the Forum at the first meeting. Ideas...

Time and frequency - meetings will usually be held once a term.

Duration - 45 minutes, and no more than one hour. The programme will be shared before the meeting.
